When opioids or other substances are used during pregnancy, the infant may be born with withdrawal from these substances taken by the mother. NAS Is associated with physiologic and behavioral consequences, such as low birth weight, feeding difficulties and respiratory problems. (9) Birth Defect. Statue 253.12. "Birth defect" means any of the following conditions affecting an infant or child that occurs prior to or at birth and that requires medical or surgical intervention or interferes with normal growth and development: 1. A structural deformation, disruption or dysplasia. 2. A genetic, inherited or biochemical disease. (1)</p> <p>*2 Wisconsin Public Records law Basics On March 11, 2016, the Governor issued Executive Order #189 reaffirming the importance of transparency in state government and asked agencies to implement best practices to promote the public's access to the records of their government under Wisconsin's Public Records Law.
